
Dyed in the Wool A Free-Form Hand Embroidery Project on Wool

- Place tracing paper on the sheep pattern and trace it with a black marker.
- Pin the tracing in place onto the wool with straight pins.
- Select a size 8 or 5 pearl cotton thread in a color contrasting to the background fabric.
 Use a size 3 embroidery needle.
- Follow the black marker lines on the tracing and stitch the outline of the design on the wool using Running Stitches.
- After stitching the outline, remove the paper using the tip of a pin to score the paper next to the stitches. Gently rip away the paper.
- The Running Stitches define the edges of the design and will be removed after outlining the shapes with permanent stitches.
